# **Training Overview**

C-level executives are referred to as "whales" by malicious hackers because of the wealth of business information they hold. For that reason, an executive must have a certain level of security awareness that makes them resilient to different types of cyber-attacks. Additionally, there is a responsibility on top management to drive the overall cybersecurity policy of the business. This training program has been designed to address those two needs: the corporate and the individual responsibility of a business executive towards cybersecurity. Participants will learn how to view cybersecurity as a business challenge rather than as an IT challenge. This shift in paradigm results in a proper governance of cybersecurity within the company. The training program will show how to build a successful security policy and implement it using a top-down approach. After that, participants will learn their individual responsibilities in spotting targeted attacks (e.g., spear phishing, business email compromise, etc.), as well as protecting their mobile devices and securely surfing the web. We have to stress that the training is accompanied by live engaging exercises and gamified demonstrations.
